His affection extended to his friends who referred to him as "Knock Knock", creating lasting memories with his contagious laugh and playful spirit. He shared a special bond with his nephew "Stinky". Nathaniel would always say, "I want some pig feet, I want some neck bones", savoring his favorite dishes with hot sauce and bbq. This playful exchange became a cherished routine, highlighting the warmth and closeness of their relationship.

Though they never married, Nathaniel held a deep and abiding love for Lisa Yvette Moss, whom he often spoke of with great affection.

Nathaniel is preceded in death by his parents, Dorothy and Billy Enoch, Sr., his sister Janet Marie Simos (Andrew), and his daughter Janet Rene Enoch.
